## OVERVIEW

PITC H, HIT \& RUN ${ }^{T M}$ tests three of the most fundamental aspects of baseball-pitching, hitting and running.

PITCH: Participant is tested
throwing strikes to a designated "Strike Zone" target.

HIT: Youngster hits a ball off a stationary tee for distance and accuracy.


RUN:


Youngster is timed, starting from second base, touching third then home.

All of the events are individually
scored and converted to a total point score through the use of conversion tables. Boys and girls compete together at all levels of competition.

Each participant will compete in each of the three components of PITCH, HIT \& RUN ${ }^{\text {mm }}$, and accumulate a total score based on his/ her performance.

## LEVELS OF COMPETITION

PITCH, HIT \& RUN ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ is a national grassroots program that has four levels of competition - Local, Sectional, Team Championship and $N$ ational Finals.

The first level is of a LOCAL scope. Everyone must participate in a local competition in order to advance to the higher levels. Champions at the local level advance to the SECTIONAL Competitions. At this level, the Sectional 1st Place All-A round Champions qualify to advance to the TEAM CHAMPIONSHIPS, which are held during June in all 30 Major League Baseball ${ }^{\circledR}$ markets. The culmination occurs at the NATIONAL FINALS, held in Chicago, IL at the 2003 M ajor League Baseball ${ }^{\circledR}$ All-Star Game ${ }^{\circledR}$.

## HOW TO ADVANCE

Each youngster M UST first participate at a local competition. The 1st Place All-A round, Pitching, Hitting and Running Champions in each age group advance to the Sectional competition.

At the Sectional, the youngster must be a 1 st Place AllA round Champion in his/ her age group, in order to qualify to advance to the Team Championship. The Sectional All-Around Champions' scores are compared with the other Sectional Champions' scores in that respective $M L B^{T M}$ tea $m$ market to determine the Top 4 participants in each age group that advance to the Team Championship. The Sectional Champion does NOT automatically advance to the Team Championship.

After the Team Championships, the All-A round Champions in each age group are ranked nationally by total score. The champions' scores from all 30 team markets are compared and the Top 4 in each age group nationwide advance to the $N$ ational Finals in Chicago, IL.
